

We prepare students—one at a time—to meet the challenges of academic achievement and teach them the skills necessary to succeed in middle school, high school, college, and beyond.





letter from the executive director

Dear Friends,

For over 30 years, Peninsula Bridge has used an innovative approach to develop 21st century learning skills of creativity, innovation, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills in our students. Persistent, long-term support is the only model that will ensure our students graduate from high school and college, ready for careers.

Our 12-year model follows a student from 5th grade to college completion and is unique with its comprehensive, whole-child, active learning approach. Our goal is to close the achievement gap to boost graduation rates and postsecondary success.

Every year we get one step closer to celebrating college graduation. In June 2019, twenty-eight 12th graders graduated from Peninsula Bridge's High School Academy and are now attending colleges and universities across the country. This is a 100% college enrollment rate for our students compared to the national average of 52% for low-income students. Now, we have 45 students benefiting from our expanded 12-year support model. We are so proud of our students' hard work and determination.

Peninsula Bridge programs enable students to thrive in their academic and personal lives. As one student, Dorian, said so eloquently, "Peninsula Bridge changed my life. My confidence level started going up – I can now raise my hand and have a voice in class. I know if I fall, Peninsula Bridge will pick me up and help me."

As we reflect on the past 30 years, we are amazed at how much has been accomplished. In short, Peninsula Bridge has transformed into a top-notch college access and completion organization. Through generous funding from all of you, we now offer robust, year-round support to 690 students enrolled in our 12-year program.

Thank you for helping Peninsula Bridge successfully provide equal opportunities to the students who need it most on the Peninsula. We look forward to sharing more Peninsula Bridge accomplishments in the year ahead.

fast facts



37% of all children in San Mateo and Santa Clara counties qualify for free or reduced price lunch. (NCES 2016).

100% of Peninsula Bridge students are socio-economically disadvantaged.



College graduation rate for first-generation students from low-socioeconomic backgrounds is 11% compared to 60% of students from high-SES backgrounds. (NCES 2015).

Peninsula Bridge's goal is a 90% college graduation rate for our students.




Americans with four-year college degrees made 98% more an hour on average in 2013 than people without a degree. (Economic Policy Institute 2013).

Peninsula Bridge is helping to break the cycle of poverty and greatly increase students' chance for success in school, life, and career.



middle school academy

Year-round middle school academic and social-emotional support



positive results for our middle school students

95% of middle school students report an increase in academic motivation, self-confidence, perseverance, social skills, and an increased sense of belonging.

99% are confident that they will go to college.

100% feel supported by the staff and teachers at Peninsula Bridge.

95% feel like they belong at Peninsula Bridge.

97% of our students improved their math skills and 87% improved their writing skills during the crucial time over the summer.

99% of parents are satisfied with the quality of the Peninsula Bridge After School Program.

Students will enter high school with 100 combined hours of STEM (hands-on science and computer science) education.

Overall, Peninsula Bridge students reported statistically significant positive change on all of the 14 Holistic Student Assessment subscales (a data-driven tool to promote social-emotional development in school and after school settings):

Trust Empathy | Reflection | Optimism | Learning





high school academy



our impact at the high school level is clear

96% of our high school students report they want to go to college and understand the college landscape.

99% feel supported by staff.

92% of students report that Peninsula Bridge has given them the tools to successfully apply to a higher education program fit for them.

100% of our 12th grade students outperformed all students across the country on the SAT by an average of 10%.

96% of our 12th grade students completed A-G college preparatory courses with the minimum GPA required for UC/CSU admissions, compared to 43% of all 12th graders in California.




